



























## Chronology of religious architecture in New Jersey 1703-1900

The churches for each denomination, reading left to right [town (county) name]. Churches pictured are not necessarily representative of each period, for there usually are differences between urban and rural areas in both scale and style, even within a denomination. Where I had a choice I have selected examples that have not been modified in later years. The number in parentheses at the end of each section is the number of churches of that denomination in the photographic inventory.
